

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


- 1. Bolt (M5) (x3)
- 2. Hex Key
- 3. Tightening Screw



# **Assembly Instructions**

## Step 1:

- A. Prior to beginning assembly, ensure you have all the parts and hardware in the User Guide.
  - **a.** Ensure nothing is damaged and lay everything out on a flat surface.
- B. Place the Cable (A) through Pillar (B): avoid breaking the cable.
  - a. When placing the Cable (A) through be careful to avoid breaking the cable.
  - **b.** Avoid pulling the connector on the cable directly.
- C. Affix the Indicator (C) onto the Pillar (B).



## Step 2:


- A. Connect the Indicator (C) and the Load Cell Cable (D), as pictured.
- B. Put the connected Cable (A) into the Pillar (B).

#### Step 3:

- A. Affix the Indicator (C) onto the scale using 3 Bolts (1).
- **B.** Secure the Bolts (1) in place using the included Hex Key (2).

## Step 4:


- **A.** Take the Height Rod (E) and stick it through the hole sticking out below the indicator's base, and into the hole in the Base (F).
- B. Going clockwise, tighten the Height Rod (E) into the Base (F) until secure.
- **C.** Adjust the Indicator (C), if needed, and secure the Tightening Screw (3) for the indicator's base, as pictured.



# Using A Height Rod

## Step 1:

- **A.** There are three sections to the Height Rod (E).
  - The base rod.
  - The middle rod
  - The slim top rod
- **B.** When the height range is between 80 140 cm, pull out the slim top rod, as pictured.
- **C.** When the height range is between 140-210 cm, completely pull out the slim top rod and then the thick middle rod, as pictured.
  - It's important that the slim top rod is pulled out **BEFORE** the middle rod.




## **Settings**

# NOTE: Having an incorrect setting may stop the indicator from working or cause further issues to develop.

- 1. Press the TARE key and hold until (pd000) displays.
  - Enter the Passcode 203 the enter the setting menu.
- **A.** F1: Capacity Setting (F1 CAP)
  - Set from 1 10000, default 200
- **B.** F2: Position of decimal point (F2 dP)
  - Set between 0 3
  - Default is 2
- **C.** F3: Division (F3 Inc)
  - Setting can be 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100
  - Default is 5
- **D.** F4: Calibrate Scale (F4 CAL)
  - E\_CAL: Zero Setting
  - Load: Load Weights
  - (XXXX.XX): Input Weight
- **E.** F5: Filter Setting: (F5 Fit)
  - 0: Low Filter
  - 1: Medium Filter
  - 2: High Filter
  - Default is 1
- F. F6: Auto Zero Range: (F6 bZ)
  - Can set OFF to stop the Zero by key
  - 20: 20% CAP
  - 50: 50% CAP
  - 100: 100% CAP
- G. F7: Auto Zero Tracking Range (F7 AZ)
  - 0: No Zero Tracking: 1; 1D; 2; 2D; 3; 3D; 4; 4D; 5; 5D
  - Default is 3D
- H. F8: Power-On Zero Range (F8 PZ)
  - OFF: No ZERO when power is on
  - 20: 20% CAP
  - 50: %0% CAP
  - 100: 100% CAP
  - Default is 20: 20% CAP
- I. F9: Factory Default Setting (F9 Rst)
  - Choose 1 to load the factory settings.

# **Key And Light Instructions**



## **Operating Instructions**

#### A. On/Off

- i. On: Press On/Off key
  - Once the power is on, the display screen will show the model and version.
  - It will then be ready to begin weighing.
- ii. Off: Press On/Off key
  - Hold down the key for 3 seconds until it fully powers down.

### **B. BMI Operation**

- i. In standard mode, have a person stand on the scale.
- ii. After the indicator is stable, press the Unit/BMI key.
  - The screen will display HI 1.75 while the last digit is flashing.
- iii. Press the Unit/BMI key to move the digit that needs to be modified.
  - Press the Print/Hold key to change the height of the person (from 0 9).
- iv. Press the TARE key to confirm the input of the height.
- v. The indicator calculates the BMI automatically and will display (b XX. XX).
- vi. Press the TARE key or On/Off/Zero key to exit BMI mode.

#### C. Zero

i. When the weight is in the setting range, press the On/Off/Zero key to make it show "0" and the zero light will illuminate.

#### D. Tare

i. If you consider the weight on the scale as tare-weight, press TARE key to display 0 and the NET light will illuminate.

#### E. Hold

- In standard weighing mode, press the Print/Hold key to hold the present weight and the HOLD light will illuminate.
  - If the weight is. in lock mode, press the Print/Hold key to cancel the weight and return to the normal weighing mode.
  - The HOLD light will turn off.

#### F. Weight Unit Converter

- i. In the standard weighing mode, press the Unit/BMI key for 3 seconds.
  - The indicator will change the unit between kg and lb.
  - The corresponding kg and lb will light up on the display screen.

## **Error Messages**

Err 1: Incorrect Password

Err 2: Out Of Setting Range

Err 3: Weight Is Too Light For Calibration

Err 4: Zero: Not Allowed Due To Weight Being Out Of Zero Range

Err 5: The Scale Is Not Stable To The Tare

Err 6: No Tare Due To Weight Is Lower Than 0

## **Mantaining**

- **DO NOT** use the scale in the below area:
  - In areas that vibrate
  - In direct sunlight
  - In high-temperatures, dusty, or wet areas
- · When plugging in the AC power supply, ensure you have a proper outlet for grounding.
- When using the DC power feature, recharge the battery before it runs out fully.
  - When the scale is not in use, power down the scale.
- **NEVER** clean the scale with solvents (such as benzene, nitro class oil).
- **DO NOT** eat or drink around or on the scale.
- The weighing indicator is a precision measuring instrument.
  - It can <u>ONLY</u> be maintained and adjusted by approved engineer or our company staff.
  - Disassembly or maintenance by any other party would make the warranty invalid as well as damage the scale.

## Warranty

- 1. Viva Comfort (the "Company" or "Tiger Companies") warrants to the purchaser that the product will be free from defects in workmanship and materials for a period of 1 year from the date of purchase. The warranty period is not extended if we repair, replace, exchange, or provide a refund for the product (as determined in our sole discretion). We may change the availability of this limited warranty at our discretion, but any changes will not be retroactive.
- 2. These warranties are not assignable or transferable to any other person, including, without limitation, any subsequent owner or other transferee of the product.
- 3. This Warranty does not apply to: (a) damage caused by misuse, tampering, abuse, neglect, or accident; (b) damage caused by improper installation, modification, or service; (c) alteration of the serial number; or (d) use that violates the instructions furnished by the Company will void this warranty.
- 4.
